Greatest Weakness

Corruption

Arroyo (14th President of the philippines) was arrested on charges of corruption and election fraud in November 2011

Political Violence

Spike in death-squad killings at the local level in 2008 and 2009

Hierarchy

Powerful families continue to hold an outsized share of land, corporate wealth, and political power.

Senior and retired military officials had been siphoning off military funds to personal accounts.

Since Aquino took office there have been seven extrajudicial killings and at least three forced disappearances

Greatest Strengths

Gender Equality

One of the few countries in Asia to have significantly closed the gender gap in the areas of health and education. Electoral Democracy

May 2010 elections marked a significant improvement over previous polls impaired by fraud, intimidation, and political violence.

Probability Of Success

It's kind of 50/50 at this point. Based on Freedom House, the Philippines could probably succeed due to its rank of civil liberties/political rights and if corruption stops.
