ASL is a complete and organized visual language that is expressed by facial expression as well as movements and motions with the hands."








- "Only deaf people use it"



Corona. Due to corona, my lessons were fully online while half of my students would be in the classroom and the other half at home.


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Slides. Greenfield uses Google Meets which resulted in me not being able to share my slides, I tried to remedy it but it did not work. I adapted to have my slides be for me.
