Tyrone Moss Simmons was born in Philadelphia on July 5, 1949. In 1968 the Franklin Fencing team were the pubic league champions. After graduating from Franklin, Simmons went on to fence at the University of Detroit. While attending the University of Detroit he won the NCAA foil championship in 71-72. Tyrone Simmons qualified for the 1972 summer Olympics and played in the team foil event. Tyrone Simmons was only the 2nd black fencer to compete on the US Olympic team. Simmons also earned gold medals in 1971 Pan American Games.
